Luke 1:46-55, NIV

And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me—holy is his name. His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation. He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts. He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble. He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."

No doubt, this will be a different and difficult Christmas for al-

most all of us. Some will spend it completely alone. Others will not be able to gather with family that they already don't see very often. A lot of travel plans have been scratched. Even many of our familiar church traditions and functions have been canceled. For some of you, having lost someone or even multiple loved ones this year will make this one of the hardest Christmases yet. And, no doubt, it's going to be difficult for many to get in the Christmas spirit this year...because it just isn't the same. Everything is so different.

This year has beaten up on a lot of us, and this particular holiday, due to the family and church traditions that have made it so special, only amplifies the sense of loss and loneliness that you may already be feeling. That feelgood high we used to get from this season of pretty lights, gift-giving, gatherings, delicious meals, and celebrations just doesn't seem like it's going to happen this year.

But the thing we remember, as Jesus followers, is that we don't live our lives just waiting for the next big event to boost us back up to another feel-good high. Our joy comes from something deeper. It's not wrong to look forward to and enjoy the special occasions and relish in the seasons of blessing, such as the beautiful, festive season of Christmas. But we should caution against setting such occasions as our *reason* for joy.

When Mary sang her song that Luke recorded for us, she rejoiced because of her salvation and the fact that she had found favor with the Lord. She knew the challenges that were on the horizon and was getting ready to face intense scrutiny for turning up pregnant and unwed. And never mind the anguish this was going to cause Joseph and their families, who would also face severe shame. And she knew, as well, that pregnancy and childbirth would be no easy assignment. Little did she know at the time that she'd be giving birth next to an animal's feeding trough.

But true praise isn't grounded in our circumstances. The blessings of the Christian life aren't based on jumping from one feelgood event to the next. They are based on a daily relationship with Jesus Christ. We can have the joy of that relationship year round, even after the tree and decorations come down. So, even if this Christmas will be very different than most, don't despair. The Mighty One has still done great things for us.


