I was reminded again over this past week how extremely blessed I am with many things I don't deserve. I'm not even sure all of it is truly a "blessing." It's sometimes a curse. We have been born into a country with rights, privileges, and affluence that we often take for granted. Many have no point of reference outside of looking around our own society, because this is the only life they've ever known. So, keeping up with the Joneses may be tough and make you envious of how the other half lives. But what an eye-opener it is when God shows you that you are the other half to so much of the world.

Twice this year, SFCC has sent mission teams to Piedras Negras, a city in Mexico that currently has hundreds of Venezuelans living in this border community, and they are awaiting their court dates as they seek asylum from their socialist country that they had to flee. Many of these folks were formerly affluent people—doctors, engineers, soldiers, teachers, etc. They lived comfortable lives just years ago, and now, they are in shelters, shabby hotels, crammed into small rooms of the homes of Mexican Christians, and other unsavory living quarters. Almost everyone left behind family in their home country, and some have family already in the states that they hope to reunite with. COVID has only exacerbated the problems with their asylum process.

Yet, most of these individuals are the kindest, happiest, most thankful people. Remember, they once lived as comfortably as you and me. It's not like they came from third-world conditions, and that's the only life they've known. They had it all, sold it all, gathered all they could, and made a costly and arduous journey to the place they now live. And by the grace of God, they fell into a community of Christ-followers in Piedras who have loved them beyond the point of what would be practical to you and me.

Once again, an eye-opener. I have it good. For some unknown reason, God has spared me from intense suffering and hardship, and for that, I am thankful. Remember that a big part of thankfulness is sharing. May we never forget how blessed we are, and most importantly, never forget to give a hand *up* to those who fall on hard times, not *just* here

around the holidays, but every day of your life.


